# Responsible Agency Notice of Determination Standard Operating Procedure October 16, 2023

This Responsible Agency (RA) Notice of Determination (NOD) Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) describes (1) the California Environmental Quality Act's (CEQA) requirements for filing an NOD and (2) the CEQA Program's instructions for completing an NOD using an NOD Template for Unincorporated Kern County, a Template for UIC Projects in Kern County, and a Template for other counties. For instructions on how to file an NOD with the State Clearinghouse (SCH), see "Filing an NOD with SCH" SOP on the CEQA Program's SharePoint site.

This SOP assists the CEQA Program's RA Project Manager (PM) in drafting an NOD to file with the SCH. This SOP shall be used in conjunction with the NOD Template form, CEQA statute, CEQA Guidelines, and case law as well as other CalGEM CEQA Program SOPs.

### CEQA Requirements for Filing an NOD

A Lead Agency (LA) or RA files an NOD for a negative declaration (ND), mitigated (MND), or environmental impact report (EIR) after the agency approves or determines to carry out a project. (14 CCR §§ 15075, 15094, 15096.) The filing of an NOD by a LA is required. The filing of an NOD by the RA is optional. If the RA chooses to file an NOD, the RA should file an NOD in the same manner as the LA. (14 CCR § 15096(i).) However, the RA does not need to state in the NOD that the EIR, MND, or ND complies with CEQA. (14 CCR § 15096(i).) Rather, the RA should state that it considered the ND, MND, or EIR as prepared by the LA. (14 CCR § 15096(i).)

Upon considering the EIR, MND, or ND, an RA must reach its own conclusions on whether and how to approve the project. (14 CCR § 15096(a).) If any feasible alternative or mitigation measures within the RA's powers could lessen or avoid any significant effect, the RA shall not approve the project. (14 CCR § 15096(g)(2).) When the RA relies on an EIR, the RA is also required to make findings for each significant effect of the project and, if necessary, to adopt a statement of overriding considerations. (14 CCR § 15096(h).)

The findings an RA must make when considering an LA's EIR are described at 14 CCR § 15091(a). In particular, the RA needs to make one or more of the following findings for each significant impact related to the parts of a project that the EIR analyzes and the RA will approve or carry out (See CalGEM RA Review SOP and RA Review Form):

- 1) Changes or alterations have been required in, or incorporated into, the project which avoid or substantially lessen the significant environmental impact;
- 2) The measures necessary for mitigation are within the responsibility and jurisdiction of another public agency and have been, or can and should be, adopted by that other agency; or
- 3) Specifical economic, legal, technological, or other considerations make mitigation infeasible.

The RA must also supply a brief explanation of the rationale for each finding. (14 CCR § 15091(a).) The RA can use the NOD to document these requirements and provide them to the public through the SCH.

An RA should file an NOD in the same manner as a LA. (14 CCR § 15096(i).) An NOD filed for an ND/MND (14 CCR § 15075) or an EIR (14 CCR § 15094) must include:

- An identification of the project, including the project title as identified on the proposed EIR/ND/MND, its location (using street address or map), and the SCH identification number. The SCH number is usually on the cover page of the EIR/ND/MND.
- 2) A brief description of the project. This should be based on the NOI project description or the PR project description.
- 3) The agency's name, the applicant's name, if any, and the date on which the agency approved the project.
- 4) The determination of the agency whether the project in its approved form will have a significant effect on the environment. For EIRs, this should be summarized in the EIRs Executive Summary listing the significant effects. For ND/MNDs, there will be no significant effects.
- 5) A statement that an EIR/ND/MND was adopted or certified pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 6) A statement indicating whether mitigation measures were made a condition of the approval of the project, and whether a mitigation monitoring plan/program was adopted. The mitigation monitoring plan/program should be included in the EIR/MND.
- 7) For EIRs, whether findings were made pursuant to 14 CCR § 15091. Generally, findings are included in an agency staff report or a RA SOP on the part of CalGEM.
- 8) For EIRs, whether a statement of overriding considerations was adopted for the project.
- 9) The address where a copy of the Final EIR/ND/MND and the record of the project approval may be examined.
- 10) If different from the applicant, the identity of the person undertaking a project which is supported, in whole or in part, through contracts, grants, subsidies, loans, or other forms of assistance from one or more public agencies or the identity of the person receiving a lease, permit, license, certificate, or other entitlement for use from one or more public agencies.

In addition, CalGEM should file the NOD with the SCH within five business days of approving a project. The filing and the SHC's posting of the NOD starts a 30-day statute of limitations on court challenges to the CEQA approval. (14 CCR § 15112(c)(1).) If an RA does not file an NOD, the statute of limitations on court challenges to the approval under CEQA is 180 days, typically from the approval date. (14 CCR § 15112(c)(5).)

A sample NOD is provided in CEQA Guidelines Appendix D. The sample NOD also includes the following, which should also be included in a NOD:

- 1) The mailing address and contact name and phone for the public agency filing the NOD.
- 2) The project's location including the county in which the project is located.
- 3) Identification of the type of public agency filing the NOD (LA or RA).
- 4) Signature of the public agency, title of signatory, date of signature and date received for filing with the SCH the Office of Planning and Research.

## <u>Instructions for Completing a CalGEM NOD Template</u>

The CEQA Program has three NOD Templates to use for filing an NOD when CalGEM is the RA on a project. Two of the Templates are for projects that are within unincorporated Kern County (UKC) and the third Template is for projects located in incorporated cities within Kern County or other counties. The NOD Templates are:

- Use this Template for Projects within Unincorporated Kern County, Attachment 1
  Use this Template for oil and gas projects that are located within UKC and when CalGEM can rely on the "Revisions to the Kern County Zoning Ordinance 2015
  (C) Focused on Oil and Gas Local Permitting" EIR (Kern County EIR) as an RA. If the use of the Kern County EIR is suspended, on hold, or staff has been told not to use the EIR for RA reviews, use the "NOD Template for Projects not in Unincorporated Kern County."
- NOD Template for Projects within Unincorporated Kern County, Underground Injection Control (UIC), Attachment 2
  - Use this Template for UIC projects that are located within UKC and when CalGEM is able to rely on the Kern County EIR as an RA for a project. If the use of the Kern County EIR is suspended, on hold, or staff has been told not to use the EIR for RA reviews, use the "NOD Template for Projects not in Unincorporated Kern County."
- NOD Template for Projects not in Unincorporated Kern County, Attachment 3
   Use this Template for all projects that are not located in UKC (i.e. incorporated cities that are in Kern County and all other counties).

If a proposed project does not fit into one of the Templates, consult with the CEQA Program Senior assigned to the project.

When drafting an NOD using one of the Templates, follow the instructions and complete sections in blue font. Most of the sections are self-explanatory, except for the project approval date and the determination section.

The date that CalGEM approved the project (e.g., issued a permit or a project approval letter) is usually the date a senior district engineer emailed staff, stating they approved the project.

The Determination section is based on the determination made by the LA in the CEQA document on which the RA review was based. Check the appropriate boxes based-on information in the LA CEQA document.

When staff completes the NOD, staff certifies the form by adding their name, their title, and the date they completed the NOD. Prior to filing an NOD with the SCH, staff must delete all blue instructional text from the NOD.

Once the NOD is certified, staff should file the NOD with the SCH within five business days of a Project's approval. While the five-day time frame is not a statutory requirement, it is the CEQA Program's goal to file an NOD within that time.
